Equine Top Priorities

Fund a 3-Year Residency, MOST NEEDED

\$80,000, Annually

This includes salary and benefits for one resident. In addition to teaching students and seeing patients, residents conduct a research project.

Standing CT Unit, MOST NEEDED

\$2.3 Million

This new technology would allow for advanced imaging of the equine head and neck without general anesthesia.

Sponsor a Resident

\$3,000

Residency programs are usually over a 3-year period and provide intense learning opportunities. Sponsor a resident by assisting with the cost of textbooks, computer and statistical software, learning aids, and continuing education events. This gives our residents the opportunity to learn the latest information and to present the results of their research at national meetings and short courses.

Wireless Radiography Unit

\$25,000

Wireless plates can be used with any x-ray generator and allow for greater safety and efficiency without cords. This equipment would be used for our sports medicine cases and in the operating rooms.

Neurology Isolation Stall \$100,000

This special stall is designed to keep horses with neurological issues safe and comfortable while protecting other patients. It offers extra space for gentle handling and includes features that reduce stress and prevent the spread of illness. Our goal is to provide the best care in a calm, secure environment.

PET Scan \$250,000

A PET scan provides detailed 3D images of your horse's lower limbs to detect issues like stress fractures or tendon injuries early. The scan is quick, safe, and performed while your horse remains standing under light sedation. This advanced imaging helps veterinarians diagnose problems sooner and monitor healing more accurately.
