Emergency Exam Fee Waiver

In an effort to enhance the experience for your clients and reduce the cost barrier associated with transfer or referral, we offer an "Emergency Exam Fee Waiver" program for select companion animal (dog and cat) patients.

How it works

- Our goal is to be an extension of your practice and, therefore, we do not want your clients to be assessed two examination fees for the same pet on the same day.
- We will waive the examination fee, an \$90 value. A \$160 emergency fee will still apply. This waiver
 applies to pets presented to our emergency service. Fees related to specialty service examination or
 consultation remain.
- Additional costs will depend upon patient status, extent of diagnostic evaluation and therapeutic support required. An estimate for all services will be provided at the time of transfer and/or admission.
- For transfers and referrals, please contact one of our emergency clinicians and send a referral form along with any medical record information and imaging studies.

Eligible patients

- Any companion animal patient that is immediately transferred from your hospital to the emergency service at our Columbus location for emergency care and/or stabilization after examination by a doctor in your practice.
- Any companion animal patient discharged by your practice and, later that day, presents to the
 emergency service at our Columbus location for a related issue. Examples include: adverse vaccine
 reaction, post-surgical complication, or worsening of condition for which the patient was examined
 and treated earlier that day.
- We request a referral form, patient discharge, or invoice from the same-day examination in your practice so we can extend this benefit to your client.

In addition to this program, the Ohio State Veterinary Medical Center Columbus is led by <u>board-certified</u> <u>Emergency and Critical Care specialists and residents</u>. Working together with highly-skilled emergency and critical care technicians, our clinicians provide state-of-the-art case management, especially for the most critically ill and injured companion animal patients.
